



### Plastic Truths I Minnette De Silva by David Robson

In this Trumpian world of fake news and casual lies, it has become acceptable for writers to take the lives of real people and re-cast them to suit their own purposes. Thus, the writer Shiromi Pinto has recently published a fictionalised account of the life of Sri Lankan architect Minnette de Silva under the bizarre title 'Plastic Emotions'. But can such cavalier distortions ever be justified if the personality of the protagonist is distorted beyond recognition, if her achievements are devalued and her ideas misrepresented, if the people who surrounded her are pilloried? Minnette de Silva was born in the British Crown Colony of Ceylon in 1918 and died in the Democratic Republic of Sri Lanka in 1998. Her Sinhalese father, George de Silva, was a man of humble origins who battled against prejudice to become a lawyer and, ultimately, an important politician in the struggle for independence. Her mother, Agnes Nell, the daughter of a Dutch Burgher engineer and his English wife, was a campaigner for women's suffrage. The family home was in the sleepy hill town of Kandy, but her parents were well-connected and played host to such visiting luminaries as Gandhi and Nehru.




Impacts of Technology upon Music I ARTRA Magazine in Partnership with Yamaha Music Centre


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### In Conversation with Anoma Wijewardene


